



ECITATION REPOSITORY

As many of you may already be aware, the Citation Record Entry (CRE) application into the state citation repository has been available for participation from agencies since April 1, 2019. The citation repository is not required by statute, so submission into the repository is voluntary. The repository is designed to collect citation data from state law enforcement agencies and make the data available to fellow law enforcement agencies. The eCitation repository will provide more information to law enforcement personnel when dealing with potential violators and will assist prosecutors with their research.

Electronic submission to the eCitation repository is also available through an interface from your agency's vendor to the KBI. The interface between Huber & Associates (Enterpol) and the KBI's eCitation repository is currently in the testing phase and will soon be deployed to all Huber & Associates agencies. If your agency is interested in submitting citation data electronically to the CRE, please contact your vendor to see if there has been any discussion of a contract with the KBI.

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ASSET FORFEITURE REPORTING IS UNDERWAY! JESSICA CROWDER, PROGRAM CONSULTANT II KBI

The new Kansas Asset Seizure for Forfeiture Repository (KASFR) that has been created per K.S.A. 60-4127 has been collecting data for about a month. Please see the questions and answers below for more clarity.

- What exactly needs to be reported?**
Any time you make a seizure of property and there is intent to potentially forfeit that property at any time, you need to fill out an incident report. This includes incidents where you decide to return the property to the owner, transfer to federal agency, or file the civil forfeiture case with the court. If the property was seized strictly as evidence with no intent to forfeit, you do not have to complete an incident report.
- Do I need to report anything now?**
The law just came into effect on July 1. You are responsible for submitting an incident report within 60 days of a disposition of the seized property. A disposition could be the signature on the journal entry or the date the decision was made to either return the property to the owner or transfer it to a federal agency. The annual financial summary report is due February 1st of every year and will collect data from the previous year.
- Do I have to report anything even if my agency doesn't do forfeitures?**
If you are an active law enforcement agency who is not covered by another agency, you must at least submit an annual report. If you had no forfeitures during the reporting period, you would simply fill out an annual report. If you have no balance, no expenditures, and no deposits, you would leave those fields as zeros.
- How do I get access to do the reports?**
The reports are located at <https://kasfr.kbi.ks.gov>. You will need to obtain a login before gaining access to submit a report. Email Jessica Crowder to gain access.

- **Is it ok if I keep seized currency as evidence instead of putting it in a bank account?**

Yes. It is ok to hold cash as evidence until it is forfeited. Make sure you have a good tracking system for that currency. You will still report it in the pending state forfeiture fund section of the annual form as if it were in a bank account. Make sure you submit an incident report after the disposition within 60 days.

- **What happens if an agency does not send information regarding their seizures for forfeiture?**

The agency will be notified that they are not in compliance and will be allowed 30 days to make a correction. If the agency does not come back into compliance by sending the requested information, the KBI Director will notify the agency's district or county attorney that the specified agency will not be allowed to do forfeitures until the agency is back into compliance.

- **Who needs to submit an incident report when more than one agency was involved in the case?**

If the seizure took place within a multi-jurisdictional task force, only the lead agency (or seizing and holding agency) would complete the incident report. If another agency receives any portion of the forfeiture, they will include that on their annual report.

Refinements to Case Management System

The date change was to allow for important refinements to the case management system before courts begin using it. These refinements will ensure the system aligns with Kansas court needs in these areas:

- Case processing
- Courtroom processing
- Financials
- Dispositions
- Forms

Track 1 Go-Live Schedule

To prepare Track 1 courts to convert from FullCourt to the new centralized case management system, the courts must stop taking electronic filings and electronic payments. Attorneys will not be allowed to fax file during this time. Pro se filers may continue to fax file.

[Supreme Court Administrative Order 302](#) establishes the schedule and procedures for case management system implementation in Track 1 courts.

The conversion schedule is:

July 30 (Tuesday)

At 5 p.m., Track 1 courts stop taking electronic filings and electronic payments.

July 31 and August 1 (Wednesday and Thursday)

Track 1 courts accept paper and fax filings. Payments must be made in cash or by paper check.

August 2 (Friday)

Track 1 courts close clerks' offices. Clerks' office staff will begin entering paper filings into new case management system.

Clerks' offices will post a telephone number for persons who need urgent court help, such as processing requests for protection from abuse or protection from stalking.

District courts will continue to operate; only clerks' offices will be closed.

August 5 (Monday)

Electronic filings and electronic payments resume at 12:01 a.m. for track 1 courts, and courts are using new case management system.

Updated and New Rules

Attorneys must follow updated and new rules:

- [Supreme Court Rule 111: Form of Pleadings and Other Documents](#) (amended June 14, 2019)

This amended rule applies to all filings in all courts. It defines the format for pleadings and other documents.

- [Supreme Court Rules 20-24: Kansas eCourt Rules](#) (adopted June 14, 2019)

Unless otherwise indicated, these rules apply to courts as they are brought onto the new case management system. They require the filer to correctly designate the case and document type. They also require the filer to indicate if the document complies with Rule 24 protecting personally identifiable information or if it is filed under seal.

These rules are necessary to protect individuals' personally identifiable information as district court records are made accessible through a public access portal as part of the new centralized case management system.

PATCH MANAGEMENT POLICY REMINDER

Here's a friendly reminder to review KCJIS Policy **5.10.4.1** - Patch Management. In short, failure to address vulnerabilities in your information systems will be found out of compliance.

For instance, some of you may have received notices or otherwise been reminded of upcoming dates about Microsoft products that will no longer be supported.

Windows 7 reaches end of life on January 14, 2020...meaning Microsoft will discontinue all FREE support including fixes to address new breaches, exploits, viruses, and attacks, leaving Windows 7 computers vulnerable. Microsoft will offer **paid** support for a limited time after next January (For users of Windows 7 Professional and Windows 7 Enterprise, you can purchase Extended Security Updates through January 2023. For an in-depth FAQ about Windows 7 Extended Security Updates, please download the [Microsoft End of Support FAQ](#)).



Without maintenance support, Windows 7 will no longer be compliant, and more importantly, your network and any connected enterprises with which they share a trust relationship is vulnerable.



How to Prepare?

The best thing to do, is work with your IT Administration as soon as possible. Target all your Windows 7 PCs (or OTHER End of Life products) and create a plan to upgrade or replace them.

Instead of using an unsupported operating system, upgrade to the most recent OS. Windows 10 provides better security, and Microsoft will provide support for it through October 13, 2025.

Upgrading to a new operating system takes time and careful planning, particularly if you have numerous machines and systems. A smooth and successful transition to a new operating system requires you to:

- Identify machines that need to be upgraded or replaced
- Develop a timeline and budget to upgrade or replace
- Employees may need to be trained on the new system
- Implement security controls to separate critical systems from Windows 7 machines that cannot be upgraded or removed

Did you know? OpenFox – Log Off or Close

Did you know there is a difference in how messages are routed when you log out of OpenFox? Many agencies have trouble-node routing configured for their primary terminal. This allows messages to roll over to another terminal(s) when the primary “Deliver To” terminal goes down or becomes unavailable.

When using the “log off” option in OpenFox, messages will continue to be delivered to your terminal as if you were still logged in. If this terminal happens to be the “Deliver To” or primary terminal for your agency, and trouble-node routing is in place, those messages will not be routed. This is important to know, especially if this terminal is responsible for hit confirmations. A log off could be used when there is a shared network login account to a computer, but there are multiple OpenFox users. One user logs out, and the next shift logs in.

On the flip side, closing out of OpenFox will stop messages coming to the terminal and will initiate the trouble-node routing if applicable. To close out of OpenFox, you can click the “X” in the upper right hand corner, or you can click the small terminal icon in the upper left hand corner, or you can simply use the keyboard shortcut of **ALT+F4**.

NLETS – GVQ/GVR Implemented

NLETS released the new VIN Assist Service. The VIN Assist capability provides Nlets users with information about a vehicle based on the decoding of the VIN. The VIN assist transaction will leverage data provided by the National Highway Transportation Safety Administration Service. This capability will utilize the Nlets GVQ transaction destined to NL (Nlets) searching on the VIN.

When sending a GVQ the destination code NL is automatically set. By searching on VIN, users will receive specific vehicle details such as vehicle type, vehicle make, vehicle model, model year and much more. More information on the GVQ can be found on the Nlets Wiki site (<http://wiki.nlets.org>)

A PWR (Power) Tag?

When running a Kansas PWR (Power) or Apportioned license tag, please use the KAQ (Kansas Apportioned Query) which is located on the KDOR form. You do not need to add "PWR" when running the query, but you will need to include the registration year in your query. Remember, if you do not get a return, you can retry using the year before or the year after. The Kansas Car Stop (KCS) will not return the information for in-state queries.

For out of state apportioned or PWR tag queries, you can use the KCS or the RQ (NLETS Vehicle Registration Query) message key.

- A common error we see on offense reports is that the statute listed is no longer in effect. When choosing the statute violation, please choose the appropriate updated statute for that offense by ensuring the discontinued date is blank. Email Shannon or Dana with a request for the current KIBRS Statute File to aid in locating the correct statute.
- Many agencies have questions regarding *Criminal Use of a Financial Card*-
 - There will usually always be three victims –
 - Card Holder
 - Card Acceptor
 - Card Issuer
 - Each time the card is used, a separate incident will be reported.
