Call to Order

David Yocum, Board Chair, called the meeting to Order at 8:34 a.m.

Approval of Agenda (Additions/Deletions/Changes)

Motion and second to approve with the addition of Senate Bill 76 made by Burgardt and Holm, respectively. Motion carried.

Consolidation of the Kansas Board of Cosmetology and Board of Barbering

Chiquita Coggs, Executive Director, presented to the Board the Governor's recommendation of the consolidation of the Kansas Board of Cosmetology and the Kansas Board of Barbering. Ms. Coggs provided to the Board an overview of the benefits of the two Boards consolidating.

David Yocum, Board Chair, informed the Board of his meeting with Barbering Board members and indicated the Barbering community expressed concerns about losing autonomy should the consolidation occur.

The Board discussed the proposed consolidation of the Boards-and the impact it would have on the agency as a whole.

Ms. Coggs provided background information on previous proposals with consolidating the Boards. Prior discussion included having three (3) additional members added to the Board to represent the barber profession and the addition of 1.5 full-time employees in office to assist with

the additional workload. Each profession regulated under the Board would retain their autonomy, as this is a consolidation not a merger, and the individual laws set forth in the Kansas statutes will regulate and govern all professions consolidated with the Board. Ms. Coggs also informed the Board that the bill for consolidation currently does not exist and there has been no further discussion on when the introduction of the bill will actually occur.

Mr. Yocum requested approval to testify in front of the Legislative Committee on behalf of the Board should testimony be necessary.

Motion and second to approve Mr. Yocum speaking on behalf of the Board in front of the Legislative Committee made by Burgardt and Holm, respectively. Motion carried.

Senate Bill 76

Ms. Coggs requested permission to provide opposition testimony for Senate Bill 76.

Senate Bill 76 proposes waiving licensing fees for regulatory and licensing boards for low-income individuals and military personnel.

Motion and second to approve Ms. Coggs providing opposition testimony for Bill 76 made by Burgardt and McCarthy, respectively. Motion carried.
