**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO
ADMINISTRATIVE REGULATION**

A public hearing will be conducted at 9:00 a.m., on the 24th day of September, 2008, at the Topeka & Shawnee County Public Library, 1515 SW 10th Avenue, Room 101B, Topeka, Kansas 66604, to consider the amendment of K.A.R. 68-7-12b of the Kansas Pharmacy Board.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed amendment of K.A.R. 68-7-12b. All parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Executive Secretary of the Kansas Pharmacy Board, Debra Billingsley, pharmacy@pharmacy.ks.gov or Landon State Office Building, 900 SW Jackson, Room 560, Topeka, Kansas 66612-1231. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the amendment of the regulation during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation to participate in the hearing should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting the Kansas Pharmacy Board, Landon State Office Building, 900 SW Jackson, Room 560, Topeka, Kansas 66612-1231, (785) 296-4056. Handicapped parking is located on the west and north sides of the building, and the north entrance to the building is accessible to individuals with disabilities.

The regulation is proposed for amendment. A summary of the proposed regulation is as follows:

K.A.R. 68-7-12b. Incident reports. This regulation identifies the information that shall be included in an incident report when a pharmacist becomes aware of a reportable incident. The regulation also specifies what constitutes a reportable incident and the recordkeeping requirements regarding an incident report.
